NEW BEDFORD OIL MARKET.

SPERM—Continues in good demand, and the sales of the week amount to about 2250 bbls as follows:—1300 bbls cargo of Geo. Porter, at 105 cts; 700 bbls, balance cargo of Iris, and lots amounting to 250 bbls at prices not transpired.

WHALE—The market for Whale remains about the same as last reported. We notice sales of 1100 bbls N W Coast, in lots, at 37 cts; 300 bbls do at 36 1/2 cts; 200 bbls, half S Sea, at 36 1/2 cts; 200 bbls, do, at 35 1/2 cts; 200 bbls do, at 36 cts; 200 bbls N W Coast, ground tier, at 35 cts; 100 bbls do at 36 cts; 350 bbls S Sea and ground tier at 35 cts; 350 bbls do at 34 cts; and yesterday a lot of 300 bbls, half South Sea, at 36 cts.

DOMESTIC MARKETS.

BOSTON, Feb. 23, 1847.—CANNERS—There is no change in Sperm, and the sales since our last have been light, and stock small. In Moulds there have been steady sales without change in prices.

NEW YORK, Feb. 20.—CANNERS—Sperm are in demand, and with a light stock prices tend upwards—sale of 500 bbls. has been made at 30 cents, short time—some holders now ask more.

FOREIGN MARKETS.

LONDON, Feb. 23.—Oils—Linedseed, in consequence of large orders from America, advanced from 25s 6d to 27s per cwt, which has been freely paid; tendency still upwards; Crushers refuse to make further sales for the present. Sperm sells at 87 @ £59 per ton; very little offering. Southern Oil worth 27 @ £29 10s per ton, but not much enquired for.

LIVERPOOL, Feb. 23.—Oils—For Seed demand good. No material change in Linedseed. Fish varied little, demand fair. Cod still sells at £26 10s, Sperm £20, and Pale Seal at 89 1/2; 240 per ton; none of latter remains with importers, and this is also the case with Southern Whale, which is about £3 1/2 per ton.

HAYRE, Feb. 23.—WHALEBONE—Demand rather active, but prices have not varied—5 tons NW sold at £2 47 1/2, and 2 Southern at £2 70 per 1/2 kil for consumption; 34 tons NW, deliverable from month to month, during the year, taken at £2 45 per kil, d. p. Stock 110 tons against 60 tons last year.

PILOT BOATS.—At the Vineyard, Superior, 50 tons; Hiram 62; Hornet 31; Relief 42; Josiah Sturgis, 58. At New-Bedford, sch. Favorite 30 tons; Commerce 25.

The fees for Pilotage are established at one dollar fifty cents per foot for outward bound vessels, and two dollars for vessels bound into port; with an addition of 20 per cent. for vessels boarded from 15th Sept. to 15th March, without a lile to extend S. E. by S. from Beaver Tail Light House, till it intercepts a line S. W. from Nom m's Land.

The common cruising ground of the Pilot boats is off Block Island and Noman's Land and frequently they extend their range at sea as far as the south side of Long Island and Nantucket Open sailboats with branch pilots also cruise near Cuttyhunk Island, in order to assist vessels coming into the Western passage.

It is expected that if any of the Branch Pilots above named shall during any portion of the summer or winter months engage in any other business which may prevent them from acting as Pilots, that they will return their commissions to the Wardens of the Port.
